Color/Grain Variation Angelim Pedra

Variations in color and grain are inherent in natural materials, contributing to their unique appeal compared to manufactured products. This is especially evident in wood, where different species exhibit varying degrees of grain and color diversity. When evaluating wood samples, keep in mind that Black Label™ wood products feature mixed grain and are not sorted for color uniformity.

Angelim Pedra, for example, has a natural characteristic that manifests as random stains called “stones,” and its grain is notably interwoven and coarse.



To achieve some color consistency, wood can be finished with a pigmented penetrating oil-based sealer or left to weather and grey naturally. Factors such as grain, density, and moisture content influence the finishing process, and each piece of wood, even from the same tree, will react differently to finishes. It is recommended to test finishes on samples before proceeding with the entire application.
