Color/Grain Variation Dark Red Balau

Natural materials, including wood products, often display color and grain variation, which is part of their inherent beauty and distinguishes them from manufactured products. This is especially true for wood, where some species exhibit more or less variation in grain and color. When evaluating wood samples, it's important to keep in mind that Black Label™ wood products feature a mixed grain and are not sorted by color.



Achieving some degree of color consistency in wood can be done by using a pigmented penetrating oil-based sealer or by letting the wood weather or grey naturally. Factors such as grain, density, and moisture content can influence how a finish appears. Since every piece of wood, even from the same tree, may react differently to finishes, it is recommended to test finishes on samples before applying them to the entire project.
